McGregor Makeover

Cidewalks on South McGregor Avenue and accompanying Oroad improvements are finally a work in progress! The Village of Spring Hill, Inc. (TVSH) has dreamed of and worked toward the installation of sidewalks on McGregor for almost ten years. Though we did not receive the highly competitive state TAP grant the City applied for on our behalf, City Council members Joel Daves and Gina Gregory (whose districts overlap parts of the McGregor corridor) shared our passion for the project. They agreed to fund the majority of the cost as a Capital Improvement Project, made possible by the renewal of the 1% sales tax. The community rallied around the project as well and raised \$50,000 from private contributions, which, when added to Sidewalk-A-Thon proceeds, enabled TVSH to contribute \$80,000 to the sidewalk portion of the project as an incentive. Thank you to all who helped make this possible! And thank you to Joel and Gina for partnering with us and working so hard for the Village!

Sidewalks are only a part of this mammoth undertaking. The City determined that extensive infrastructure upgrades needed to be made at the time the sidewalks were installed. The project has been challenging with the twists and turns of McGregor Avenue, the drainage improvements, the added curb and gutter infrastructure, the street re-paving, and of course the RAIN! But everyone has patiently persevered, and all eagerly await the completion of another outstanding project for the Village.

Enhancing the neighborhood ambiance of our new sidewalks will be an Old Mobile bench placed along the route just south of Spring Bank Road by **T. Lee Robinson and family** in memory of Helen Robinson, who was one of The Village of Spring Hill's earliest supporters and advisors. Another bench will be placed in the sharp curve near the intersection of McGregor Avenue and Vickers Lane by a friend of The Village of Spring Hill.

Phase II of the project on the *west* side of McGregor Avenue will begin in 2018. When all is complete, at a cost of over \$1,000,000, McGregor Avenue will indeed shine, with sidewalks on both

sides all the way from Old Shell Road to Dauphin Street! It will be a point of pride for all of Mobile.

Sidewalk-A-Thon Success

Who could have imagined that children would establish one of the most significant fund-raising efforts for the Village? Since the very first Sidewalk-A-Thon in 2012, Village children and event sponsors have contributed almost \$200,000 for additional sidewalks! The importance cannot be overemphasized. These funds have been critical to The Village of Spring Hill, Inc.'s efforts to provide the engineering costs and the 20% matching funds required for TAP grants the City of Mobile has been awarded on our behalf. Sidewalk-A-Thon proceeds have helped make possible sidewalks along Old Shell Road and those now in progress along South McGregor Avenue. Sidewalks were the #1 request of residents at our first community meeting in 2006, and walkers of all ages can now be found all along the routes from daylight to dusk.

TVSH Board of Directors has been very involved in the annual Sidewalk-A-Thons since the beginning. Former board member **Susan Carley** gave outstanding leadership to the first event in 2012. Other current or former board members who have chaired the event are **Bonnie Fuchs**, **Bradley Sanders**, and **Buff Teague**. Board member **Sherry Pierce** is now in her third year of serving as chair of the event.

The 2017 Sidewalk-A-Thon raised a record \$44,500, thanks to the children who participated and the generous sponsors of the event. TVSH wishes to gratefully acknowledge the major corporate sponsors of the 2017 Sidewalk-A-Thon.

Bit and Spur Sidewalks

no more bits and pieces!

Engineering plans are being finalized for sidewalks on the north side of Bit and Spur Road, beginning at the commercial area on Old Shell Road and continuing west all the way to University Boulevard. The project will include repairs to a small "piece" of sidewalks already in place along the route and connect it to the new sidewalks. Construction is expected to begin in

the fall of this year. The Village of Spring Hill, Inc. is once again responsible for the engineering costs and the 20% match of the state \$200,000 Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) grant that was awarded for the construction. Our total obligation is approximately \$60,000. Fundraising is ongoing for this project. Please consider a contribution to help fund another great addition to our sidewalk network.



The Need for Sidewalks!

Sidewalks beyond Myrtlewood

This year the City of Mobile, through the efforts of The Village of Spring Hill, Inc., was awarded another state TAP grant for sidewalk construction. The grant of \$200,000 will fund sidewalks on the north side of Old Shell Road from Myrtlewood Lane to the I-65 West Service Road. Once this project is complete, sidewalks will extend from Lavretta Park all the way to I-65. The sidewalk project has been approved by the City Council, and construction is expected to begin sometime next year. TVSH must first raise money for the engineering costs and the 20% matching funds, totaling around \$60,000. You can help! The roundabout at McGregor Avenue and Museum Drive has totally transformed the traffic pattern of what was once called malfunction junction. Since its completion TVSH has been working to enhance the area with landscaping. In phase #1 of our plan, over \$20,000 of Ligustrums and live oak trees were planted to encircle the perimeter with lush, green growth.



With the abundance of rain over the past several months, the new plantings have thrived. Funding for the trees was made possible through collaboration between TVSH and the Mobile Tree Commission and a special gift from the Samford Foundation. Phase #2

will include the planting of ornamental trees in the green spac-

es and the placement of more Old Mobile benches like those already in place in the Village. Phase #3 will focus on the center of the roundabout. Watch for something really special there!

What Is the Blue Building on North McGregor Avenue? ...a New/Old Concept

Eleven years ago a group of Spring Hill residents set out to initiate positive change in Spring Hill. The overwhelming desire of residents, property owners, and business owners was to make Spring Hill a truly walkable community with a real neighborhood sense of place. This is not actually a new concept but an old concept like neighborhoods once were before there was a major focus on automobiles and parking lots in front of buildings.

Jeff and Cheryl Quinnelly embraced this concept and began acquiring dilapidated houses along North McGregor Avenue and demolishing them to make room for their new/old development. The blue building, which will house a gift shop and art gallery on the first floor and office space on the second floor, is almost complete and is only the first of their planned seven buildings to be constructed in a row for small shops and offices. Their goal is to serve the surrounding neighborhoods with a development that will be pedestrian friendly and add to the ambiance of historic Spring Hill.
